The Village rose to the occasion and we had thirty more Scarecrows than the previous year and through the Post Office donation box and postal donations raised more than the previous year.

It would be a great shame if we lost our annual Scarecrow Festival and with no Garden Party planned again this year we intend to repeat last year's community celebration throughout the summer. This is not primarily a money making event. It's focus is community; but I will be asking Bob to accept donations in the Village Shop again. Posters will be printed and Facebook's "High Halstow Scarecrow Festival" page activated.
