High Halstow Primary Academy.

I am delighted to report that a very worthwhile meeting occurred recently between myself and Mrs Gemma Stangroom, Head Teacher, High Halstow Primary School. Mrs Stangroom is keen for children to have an awareness of community issues in the village and has suggested ways in which our activities might support the school's educational aims. A first indication may be the exhibiting of work from the children's Remembrance Week in our weekend of Remembrance activity. The School was the first group to book a Christmas Tree Festival place. We both believe that further collaboration will be beneficial.

Monies Raised

Monies raised from these events and your subscriptions totalling over £5000 have allowed us to part fund an electrical upgrade and extensive drainage works. Currently the roof and windows are our main focus and they require urgent action.

Gift Aid

It would be appreciated if anyone able to gift aid their donations and have not completed the necessary form, do so to take advantage of the extra income this would generate.

National Heritage Lottery Fund.

The Committee have prepared an Expression of Interest in making an application for funding to address the extensive list of remedial issues and eventually those works that could improve the range of uses for our historic building. This is a complicated task and we would be delighted to receive help from persons who have experience of making such applications. Any useful skills from Members or acquaintances would be very welcome. This initiative if successful could immensely significant. Other Peninsular Churches have been successful, why shouldn't we?
