This year we intend to combine our Scarecrow Festival with The Queen's Platinum Jubilee Celebrations and the Scarecrows will be displayed at the Village Jubilee Celebration Day,

Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June, and then in your front gardens and in the Churchyard to coincide with the Church Garden Party before returning to your front garden.
