#### Subscriptions

We have 46 standing subscriptions. 43 monthly and 3 annually.

We lost four during the year with only one new addition.

This gave us a reduction £690 revenue, the first year our revenue through subscriptions has fallen

#### Debtors

We have only one debtor, the HMRC for the Gift Aid refund of £1,330.87.

## Fund Raising

Following the pandemic fundraising has returned to near normal and the six events held helped raise £1900.19 including Carol and Chris's new gardening initiative.

#### Administration Expenses

These were £491.23 for insurance and hall hire

#### Funds to PCC

£16243.33 was given towards quinquennial repairs and £1394.20 for roof repair preparation. The PCC repaid £2641.97 after VAT was recovered

#### Audit

The accounts have been independently audited

#### Bank Balance

At the end of the financial year, we had a bank balance of £37995.76 with no cash in hand

## Chairman's Annual Report

The Friends of St. Margaret's Church have had a successful year with well supported events which, with members' subscriptions raised £13,176 This helped fund the £17,637 repairs carried out in the year to the Church in line with the guinguennial survey.

Our next challenge is to support the Parochial Church Council in helping to fund the replacement of the temporary roofing that was installed after the theft of lead. This is a complicated process and an Architect has been appointed. Currently the necessary planning consent is awaited from the local council who liaise with English Heritage. Approval will then be sought from the Diocese.

## Organ restoration fund.

A new fund has been set up to restore our Victorian Church Organ. It is proving to be very popular and donations have been coming in steadily. Alastair Curtis, an organ tuner and restorer has surveyed the Organ and has prepared a restoration specification and quotation of £18000.
